Ambassador Eduardo Tempone is a career diplomat. He joined the Argentinian Foreign Service in 1986.

Since February 2020, he had served as an Alternate Representative of Argentina to the G20 (Sous-Sherpa) based at the Argentine Embassy of the Argentine Republic in the United States of America. Previously, he was the alternate chair of the Argentine Presidency in the Trade and Investment Working Group at the G20 in 2018.

Ambassador Tempone was the National Director of Multilateral Economic Relations of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Worship (2015-2020), in charge of formulating and implementing policies and courses of action on multilateral economic negotiations within the framework of the WTO, G-20, FAO, UNIDO, WIPO, UNCTAD, and other multilateral trade organizations. He also represented the OECD's National Contact Point for Corporate Social Responsibility from 2016 to 2020.

His first diplomatic posting was at the Embassy of the Republic in Paraguay (1991-1997). He subsequently served in the Permanent Mission to International Organizations in Geneva (2001-2008) and the Embassy of the Argentine Republic in Washington D.C. (2011-2015)

Ambassador Tempone began his diplomatic career in the South America Division (1988-1990 and 1990-1991) and worked in the Legal Division on International Economic and Foreign Investment Law issues.

He graduated in Law at the National University of Córdoba and International Relations at the Catholic University of Córdoba and earned an M.A. in International Affairs from The American University (Washington DC).
